

IRP Project Menu

Purpose:

- To represent your book in a way that shares the book beyond plot, characters, and setting
- Your work must be worthy of being displayed or presented
- It must generate interest in the book

All options must clearly show book title and author. Projects will not be accepted without title and author. Proofread! Major points taken off for errors that could have easily been caught by proofreading.

1. ABC BOOK: Create an ABC book focusing on key events, characters, ideas, and themes from the book. All letters of the alphabet must be presented
2. MURAL: Select images from the book and draw them as a mural
3. DEFEND: “This book should be read by anyone who hates reading!” Write an essay defending this claim. This claim should appear in the first paragraph of your essay. Give specific reasons using evidence from the text that supports your claim.
4. TIMELINE: Create a timeline of your plot for your novel. Place the most important events in chronological order.
5. INTERVIEW: Write ten questions and answer them in the voice of your protagonist. You can use a celebrity interview as your model.
6. PERSONAL EXPERIENCE: Describe an experience you’ve had that is similar to the events in the novel. .
7. ADVERTISEMENT/POSTER: Create an ad that promotes your novel.
8. PRESENTATION: Give an in-class presentation of your book.
9. LIBRARY REVIEW: Must include: title, author, length, short summary (1 paragraph) and your rating (1-5 stars.) See an example at http://english.cailab.net/activities/irp/IRP_Review.png.
