

Character Map Project

What is this?

Over the course of the quarter, your group will create and maintain a poster on which you all represent each character in the play and characteristics about that character, such as demographics, idiosyncrasies, likes, dislikes, and personal traits. You should also include notable quotes. You add characters and information as we read the play.

Why are we doing it? What is the goal?

To help you visualize the relationships between characters and to define the characters themselves. This will also help you when it comes time to complete your character journal entries

How is it graded?

Two ways. First, the teacher will give your group credit or no credit for the project at the end of the quarter. Second, other classes will judge the posters from your class and choose a winner. The winning team will get a special prize, to be determined.

What should we include in our poster map thing?

- Characters
- Relationships between characters (think mindmap, arrows, lines, etc.)
- Any relevant notes
- Quotes
- Drawings
- And ANYTHING else that makes sense to or helps your group

How do we get started?

Sticky notes! Start with sticky notes, please. This will save the large sheets of paper. When you're ready, you can transfer the information to the paper using pens, crayons, markers, stickers, etc.
