

Multimedia Projects Spring 2019 ELA 11

Instructions – General

1. You will be completing three projects in the final quarter of the school year.
2. Each project must be related to the main subject for the project number.
3. Each project must use a different platform chosen from the list provided by the teacher.
4. You will use a shared Google Doc to post project links, subjects, and tools.

Instructions – Technical

For full credit, each project must include:

1. At least 750 words. If the project is a video or podcast, then the script must be turned in.
2. At least three references **retrieved from our library or ERIC** (digital or hard copy).
3. At least four occurrences of media other than text. This could be three instances of one media, such as three pictures, or one instance of three different media (i.e. one image, one audio file, one video), or any other combination. (This requirement is waived for podcasts.)

Instructions – Content

For full credit, each project must include:

1. A summary of at least two issues, controversies, or questions related to your chosen subject.
2. Your personal views or opinions on each issue, supported with specific examples and sound logic.
